





5th World Chessboxing Championship 2023 Indian Team

PRESS RELEASE

Ten members represented Team India in The 5th World Chessboxing Championship which was conducted in Riccione, Italy from 28th October to 2nd November 2023. The Indian Team was led by the Founder & President of Chess Boxing Organisation of India – Mr. Montu Das.

This grand championship would be remarkable in the history as it celebrates the 20 years of Chessboxing in the World.

Chessboxing is indeed a unique and intriguing sport that combines the intellectual challenge of chess with the physical demands of boxing. Hence the sport inspires to be fit physically as well as mentally.

The motivated team cracked 2 Gold, 6 Silver and 4 Bronze medals in different Chessboxing events namely-

- 1. **Chessboxing Main event** –The traditional Chessboxing event that manages knockout and Checkmate and starts with the Chess round.
- 2. **Chessboxing Fit event** –The chessboxer needs to outshine the boxing skills on the punching bag for 1 minute and then play Chess for 5 minutes.
- 3. **Chessboxing Light event** This event starts with boxing round and only light attacks are allowed without knockout system.
